## Adventures in SO2R Land - Part 10

Prolog. So there I was, middle of a sleepless night, listening to the noise on 160 meters and contemplating requirements creep...

In a previous article I talked about the need for a sound systems engineering approach. And how a sound systems engineering approach helps minimize requirements creep. But, like in warfare, no plan survives contact with the real world. Changes happen. Events shape your thoughts and impressions. You either react to real world happenings or suffer the consequences.

Perspective and objectivity are important when re-evaluating the results of your initial systems engineering derived to-be plan for your station. In this case I was dwelling on my experiences with the Glorioso Islands DX-pedition. Maybe fixated is the operative word.

Ok, I was bummed out that I wasn't any where near first working this big one. Three days it took me.

Perspective said "well, jeez, you cracked the pile ups for Mayotte, Conway Reef, Clipperton Island in one or two calls whenever you heard them." You're getting very good real signal reports from South Africa on 80 meters." So what's the big deal? There aren't that many big DX-peditions where you need to work that hard.

Objectivity said something else. Objectivity looked at the correlation between not being loud enough to really stand out big signal to make a dent in the crowd when chasing a TX5GA and being loud in a contest. Loud is good. You need loud to stand out and entice

people to line up and answer your CQ contest calls to maintain a high rate. If others are louder than you, well that's not quite what you want.

Objectivity also said "well, without multiple towers and stack of arrays for each band, you won't be the loudest". True. I don't expect to be the loudest. I just want to be louder. The real answer turns out to be that each of us should strive to be as loud as we can be to enable your contest-ability.

How's your ground system? Don't have one? Get help and pound in a 8 ft ground rod. Get a low loss connection to your rig. You'll gain signal while lowering your noise floor for the weak ones and minimizing RFI. A cheap fix.

If you are limited to 100 watts, look at your antenna system and look for low cost, easy to implement improvements.

How old is your coax? Are you using 5 year old cheap stuff from Radio Shack? If so, you are probably loosing 2 to 3 db. Upgrade your coax, get back that 2 to 3 db. Makes a big differ-

ence.

Is your only antenna a G5RV at 30 ft and you want to do better in a DX contest? Put up a wire vertical for 20 meters. Only 16 ft tall. You'll gain 2 to 3 db over that G5RV for DX.

Is your only antenna a vertical and you want to do better in the sweepstakes or other domestic contest? Put up a G5RV at 30 ft.. You'll gain 2 to 3 db over that vertical for stateside QSOs.

Even the smallest beam fixed on Europe will make you stand out in a DX contest.

Beg, borrow, or steal a small amplifier. 600 watts gets you 7 db or so over your 100 watts.

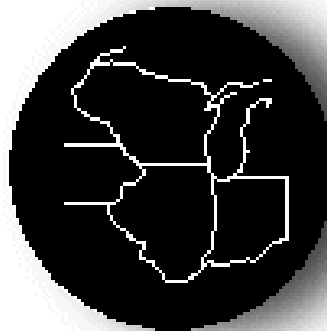
Of course, the biggest enabler of all is the time you spend in the operating chair. Get on, stay on, and make those Qs.

Oh yeah, what am I going to do? A couple of things. My beam is only at 45 ft. My long term plan had included a second tower. New tower time is now rather than later. I've been agonizing over what to do to get a second decent antenna for 20 through 10 meters. I'm going to put up another beam over the next few months (snow dependant), at 85 ft this time. That's about optimum for a 20 meter single beam. Higher would pretty much distort the pattern.

And I will lengthen my 160-80 meter vertical to 70 ft so I'm long for 80 and have a longer vertical section for the relay switched 160 meter inverted L. Add more radials as well.

Requirements creep – Yes. But necessary changes to my plan that reflect what I've learned on the air.

Preview... So there I was, lurking on the bands, working DX and just waiting for the November Sweepstakes to start when .....
